On the day of Pentecost, the effects of the Tower of Babel were overturned. The punishment of God for their rebellious sin led to the multiplicity of languages throughout the world. That also led to friction and factions among nations, cultures and peoples who struggle now to communicate with one another.

On Pentecost, a harvest celebration, people were in Jerusalem to worship at the temple from many nations of the world. On the day of Pentecost, suddenly there was a sound of a mighty wind. There were little tongues of fire that came to rest of the heads of Jesus' disciples. And suddenly, through a miracle of the Holy Spirit, the assembled crowd heard the unlearned disciples declaring the wonders of God in their own tongues. Utterly amazed, they asked: "Are not all these men who are speaking Galileans? Then how is it that each of us hears them in his own native language? Parthians, Medes and Elamites; residents of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya near Cyrene; visitors from Rome (both Jews and converts to Judaism); Cretans and Arabs we hear them declaring the wonders of God in our own tongues!" Those "wonders of God" involved the perfect life, innocent death, victorious resurrection and triumphant return to his throne of our ascended Savior, Jesus Christ. Those "wonders of God" were shared with people in their own languages, so that they could understand the message of God's plan of salvation, believe it through the Holy Spirit's power at work in Word and Sacrament, and take the saving gospel with them back to their own nations and peoples.

Now, through the miracle of God's inspired Word and the Sacrament of Holy Baptism, that saving message has also been shared with you and with me. We

would have considered it to be sheer foolishness and rejected it immediately, had it not been for the work of God's Holy Spirit in our hearts, bringing us to faith. We would have surely lost our love for the gospel and fallen away from our Savior's side, had it not been for the work of the Holy Spirit faithfully and daily keeping us in faith through the power of God's Word and Sacraments, Baptism and the Lord's Supper. We would eventually have returned to our self-centeredness and our spiritual blindness had it not been for the Holy Spirit enlightening us with his gifts and keeping us with Jesus Christ in the one true faith. The Holy Spirit is the one who motivates us to return God's love with lives of loving service lived to his glory and praise. The tools that the Holy Spirit used on the day of Pentecost are the same tools he uses in your heart and mine until he guides us safely home to heaven.

In the meanwhile, God has important work still for us to do. The things we do to demonstrate our love to God and to thank him for sending Jesus to be our Savior are called "good works." There is no need to search out spectacular and unusual activities that will impress the world. While religious activities such as church attendance, prayer, mission work, charity are all included in the work our Lord has asked us to do, secular pursuits are just as pleasing to God when they are carried out in his love and according to his will. The simple performance of our daily callings is what God expects from us first of all, and the very simplest and ordinary tasks done in obedience to his commands are good works in his sight.

As long as we are in this world, our sanctified lives will never be what they ought to be. But our faith grows ever stronger through the power of the Holy Spirit working through the gospel, and our love for our Savior will grow ever deeper by the working of the Holy Spirit. May he continue to encourage and enable each one of us to serve the Lord faithfully in everything we do, so that it may be done to his glory.

Going Nutty for Nuts!

Almonds: Contain the most fiber and vitamin E on any nut. Vitamin E can help prevent heart disease, boost the immune system and play a role in healthy skin and hair.

Pecans: Pecans are free of sodium and contain more than 19 vitamins and minerals. Pecans contain more antioxidants (cancer-fighting substances) than any other nut.

Pistachios: Contain more than 30 vitamins and minerals. Pistachios also contain arginine (an amino acid) which may help reduce blood pressure

and heal wounds.

Walnuts: Walnuts are much higher in Omega-3s than other nuts and also have a high level of antioxidants.

Try blending walnuts into oatmeal or adding pecans to yogurt. Ground nuts can be used as a coating for chicken or fish prior to baking. Combining nuts and dried fruit makes an excellent snack.
